Bangladesh model

World Bank (WB) executive director Parameswaran Iyer on Thursday said developing countries can follow Bangladesh's development model as he paid a courtesy call on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her official Ganabhaban residence in Dhaka. "Bangladesh made phenomenal transformation in development with specific plans under Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's prudent leadership. Other developing countries can follow Bangladesh development model," PM's Press Secretary Ihsanul Karim quoted Iyer as saying in a media briefing after the meeting. According to Karim, the prime minister apprised the WB official of her government's uplift programmes to ensure Bangladesh's overall development. Bangladesh witnessed huge development as her Government and party (Awami

League) do everything after formulating specific plans, Sheikh Hasina said. "Our main target is to alleviate poverty as we want to ensure better life to every person," she said. The WB executive director assured Bangladesh of extending cooperation in its infrastructure development in next phase of advancement. He said his organisation has already provided \$ 700 millions for relocation of Rohingyas. The Prime Minister said the Rohingyas will have to return to their homeland Myanmar. About the climate change, she said Bangladesh has to suffer badly the adverse impact of climate change despite the fact, "We are not carbon emitter". Iyer, however, told the premier that the WB will assist Bangladesh in implementing its Delta Plan-2100. Sheikh Hasina said

the WB is lending technical assistance for ecological restoration and ensuring navigability of rivers surrounding Dhaka city with a view to making the city more livable under an umbrella investment programme. The WB official also appreciated the country's sanitation system, saying "Bangladesh's sanitation system is remarkable." He also highly praised the private sector's role in the development describing it as thriving. The prime minister said her government has given every required support to flourish private sector. "We have opened everything to private sector," she said. Alternative executive director of the WB Ahmad Kaikaus, Prime Minister's Office (PMO) secretary M o h a m m a d Salahuddin and economic relations division secretary Sharifa Khan were present at the meeting

PM replies to empty Oppn benches Peace will prevail in Manipur, avers Modi

'Nehru, Indira to blame for NE woes'

New Delhi Aug 11
Asserting that efforts are being made by the Centre as well as the Manipur government to restore peace in the state, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday expressed confidence that the initiatives will bear results and normalcy would be restored soon in the state which has been in turmoil for over three months. He assured people in Manipur that the entire Parliament is with them and said that the state will soon be back on the path of development. Modi was replying to a debate on the no-confidence motion in the Lok Sabha moved by the Opposition, which was not present in the House when the Prime Minister spoke on Manipur as they had walked out minutes earlier. He took a dig at Opposition members saying that they first

raise the question but don't have capacity and patience to listen to the answers. The motion was later defeated by voice vote in the absence of the Opposition. During his over two-hour long speech, Modi spoke on various issues and sought to turn the table on the Opposition while blaming Congress, particularly its leaders and former Prime Ministers Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi for the festering problems ailing not only Manipur but the entire North East. The PM said that Congress and its politics were responsible for the problems in the North East. He listed several incidents of violence in the past in the region and put the blame squarely on the grand old party. Modi took a swipe at the Opposition and said that their pain is selective. "Their pain is selective.

They cannot think beyond politics," he said. Using the no-confidence motion brought against his Government, Modi said that the Opposition bloc takes pleasure in spreading negativity about the country and asserted that his Government was on track to make a hat-trick by returning to power in 2024. He also sought to bring out contradictions in the newly-minted I.N.D.I.A. alliance led by Congress and said that all the leaders in the grouping are aspiring to be the prime minister. The PM termed I.N.D.I.A. alliance as ghamandiya (arrogant). Modi remained in attack mode throughout his speech amid sloganeering by Opposition parties and walkout. He highlighted the achievements of his government in areas such as banking, infrastructure and social welfare.

Modi cited reports from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and Government think-tank NITI Aayog to state that the country has reduced poverty. The PM reiterated that India will be the third largest economy in the world during his third term. He said that when the Opposition moves the next no-confidence motion in 2028, India will become the third largest economy in the world. He accused the Opposition parties of tarnishing the image of the country on global platforms but added that people will not be misled by it. Modi said he has given a scam-free Government at the Centre. Without naming Rahul Gandhi, he launched a scathing attack on him saying that a 'failed product is being launched again and again'. The PM said that the Opposition had been

saying bad things about the country's banking system, aerospace firm HAL and state-owned LIC but all of them have been scaling new heights. Taking Congress head-on, Modi said that the country had no confidence in the party and state after state was rejecting it. He said that as and when Congress and its allies moved no-trust votes against his Government, the BJP only performed better in subsequent elections. The Prime Minister said that the Opposition had a 'secret power', as a result of which, if they wish bad, it turns into blessings instead for the rivals. Modi said that he himself is the shining example of it. The PM said that the opposition parties had used all kinds of abuses and unparliamentary words for him but he has turned them into 'tonic'.

Cong leader Adhir suspended from LS for unruly behaviour

New Delhi, Aug 11:
Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, the leader of the Congress in the Lok Sabha, was on Thursday suspended from the House soon after the debate on the no-confidence motion for making "baseless charges" and disrupting the proceedings. The motion for Chowdhury's suspension

was moved by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi, who alleged that the MP from West Bengal's Baharampur constantly caused disruptions. "Despite getting repeated warnings, he hasn't improved himself. He always makes baseless charges in his debates. He demeans the country and its image, and never apologises," said Joshi. "This House having

taken serious note of the gross, deliberate and repeated misconduct of Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury in utter disregard to the House and authority of Chair resolves that the matter of his misconduct be referred to Committee of Privileges of the House for further investigation," the resolution said. It added that Chowdhury be suspended from the service of the House till the committee

submits its report. This is the first time the leader of the Congress in Lok Sabha has been suspended. Speaking during the no-confidence motion debate, Chowdhury compared Prime Minister Narendra Modi with Mahabharata's blind kind Dhritrashtra. He also likened Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the fugitive economic offender "Nirav Modi".

ISRO releases earth images clicked by Chandrayaan

Chennai, Aug 11:
The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Thursday night released two images taken by the Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft, which was launched from Sriharikota on July 14 and has moved to the moon's surface and it was inserted into the Lunar Orbit on August 5. On August 9, ISRO carried out the third orbit reduction manoeuvre of Chandrayaan-3 and the Chandrayaan-3 is just 1,437-km away from the moon. The first image is of the earth as viewed by the Lander Imager (LI) Camera. The photo was taken on July 14, when the Chandrayaan-3 was launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota. The second image is of the Moon captured by the Lander Horizontal Velocity Camera (LHVC) on board the spacecraft on August 6. ISRO tweeted: "Chandrayaan-3 Mission: viewed by Lander Imager (LI) Camera on the day of the launch, along with earth's symbol

& imaged by Lander Horizontal Velocity Camera (LHVC) a day after the Lunar Orbit Insertion-image of moon". The Lander Imager (LI) camera on Chandrayaan-3 was developed by Space Applications Centre (SAC), Ahmedabad, and Lander Horizontal Velocity camera by Laboratory for Electro-Optics Systems (LEOS), Bengaluru. ISRO said the LI camera was developed by SAC, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, and LHV camera by the Laboratory for Electro-Optics Systems (LEOS), which is based in Bengaluru, Karnataka. ISRO had earlier released a video of the Moon, as viewed by the Chandrayaan-3 during Lunar Orbit Insertion, which took place on August 1. The SAC is spread across two campuses having multi-disciplinary activities. The core competence of the centre lies in development of space borne and air borne instruments/payloads and their applications for national development and societal benefits.

These applications are in diverse areas and primarily meet the communication, navigation and remote sensing needs of the country. Besides these, the centre also contributed significantly in the scientific and planetary missions of ISRO like Chandrayaan-1, Mars Orbiter Mission, etc. The communication transponders developed at this centre for the Indian National Satellite (INSAT) and Geo Synchronous Satellite (GSAT) series of satellites are used by government and private sector for VSAT, DTH, Internet, broadcasting, telephones etc. On the Main Engine and Stage Test Facility at SAC, it said this centre also designs and develops the optical and microwave sensors for the satellites, signal and image processing software, GIS software and many applications for Earth Observation (EO) programme of ISRO.

53 dead in hurricane-driven Hawaii wildfires

Los Angeles, Aug 11:
At least 53 people have been confirmed dead in the devastating hurricane-driven wildfires in Hawaii's Maui Island, authorities said on Thursday. "As firefighting efforts continue, 17 additional fatalities have been confirmed today amid the active Lahaina fire. This brings the death toll to 53 people," Maui County wrote on the county's official website. The death toll was 36

earlier in the day. Strong winds from Hurricane Dora were to blame for the deadly wildfires, destroying parts of Lahaina, a tourist spot on Maui Island. Officials warned the death toll could grow even higher. The wildfire that caused widespread damage in Lahaina town was reported to be 80 percent contained this morning after the fire department reported making progress in fighting the Lahaina fire

and fires in Pulehu and Upcountry Maui, said county officials in an earlier press release. Officials said that the status of all three fires remained unchanged as of Thursday afternoon. U.S. President Joe Biden on Thursday morning approved a major disaster declaration for Hawaii in the wake of the devastating hurricane-driven wildfires. Hawaii Governor Josh Green is on Maui to survey the damage.

In a video speech at the scene in Lahaina, Green said that "over a thousand buildings" have likely been destroyed. "This is a tragic day for everyone in Hawaii and the nation. Our hearts go out to the families of the victims and the survivors suffering through the deadliest natural disaster the state has seen in generations," he said in an earlier statement.
